A.C.E. Concepts

Supervisors need to go beyond the Procedures Manual and understand the concepts of A.C.E. The Five Laws of Learning, Mastery Learning, critical thinking skills and how the components of A.C.E. interact to bring about the learning outcomes.

Developing Character

One of the keys of the A.C.E. program is to develop students' character. Since education is about children and their character, educators need to understand the psychology of children, the different phases of growth, and knowledge and skills in raising children.

A.C.E. aims to develop the whole child. That includes developing children's emotions, beliefs and discipline or self-control.

Educators are not academics, but they are people who raise godly men and women.

The purpose of these Newsletters is to disseminate training material to educators, parents, teachers and pastors so they can know the issues facing Christian Education. 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Education is not merely Academic

Educators need to go beyond the academics of subject matter. Educators need to balance between skills and knowledge of Subject Matter (such as Science and Mathematics), and also be equally knowledgeable about raising children the Biblical way.

Raising Children in the Biblical way

Indonesia generally does not have good family models. We tend to be weak in our knowledge of how to raise children, even less in a Biblical way.

Eating by Walking Around

One of the jargon from Business Schools is Management By Walking Around (MBWA). In the same analogy, in Indonesia, the culture of young children eating by walking around is a common phenomenon.


Parents generally think of their children's stomach, to ensure that they do not get hungry,

even at the cost of the 'baby sitter' having to entertain the child as he walks and plays while having his meal. These same parents tend not to be aware of the discipline of eating while sitting down.

The Western world is a totally different setting. Children generally sit down when they eat even from toddler onwards. Parents will never think of them walking around while having their meals. This is almost unheard of in these countries.

Our educators therefore need to understand the issues of discipline and self-control. Without an adequate knowledge, children are brought up with lower self-discipline. They would not be as effective if they had been more disciplined.

'Discipline your son while there is hope, And do not desire his death.' Proverbs 19:18



GROWING KIDS GOD'S WAY is a comprehensive values-based parenting curriculum. In the title the authors, Gary and Anne Marie Ezzo, place their emphasis on God's Way meaning the way of the Lord. Growing Kids God's Way Or Child Wise

Education is LIFE! Education is not merely academic. Therefore Christian educators need to be more than just mere teachers of subject matter. They are also educators of souls and spirits. It is equally important to impart spiritual truths to them since:

'God is spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth.' John 4:24.

Yet at the same time,

'Those whom I love, I reprove and discipline' says the Lord in Rev. 3:19.

'Foolishness is bound up in the heart of a child; The rod of discipline will remove it far from him.' Proverbs 22:15.

And so, educators need to know WHY discipline is necessary and WHY, without it, foolishness is bound in the heart of a child. While there are many Parenting books, *Growing Kids God's Way* or *Child Wise* (the version for the general public) teaches not only the principles of discipline, but also teaches the practical aspect of discipline.
